St. Aloysius—Before it became a Catholic parish, St. Aloysius was dedicated as a Presbyterian church in 1861. It was later purchased by the Bishop of Detroit, and held its first Catholic service August 24th, 1873. Our church stood before the first street railway was built, before the first public library opened, and even before the first telephone was installed in the city. From its founding, St. Aloysius drew Catholics from all over Detroit. In April of 1930, the church was razed to make way for its present magnificent structure.

Historic Trinity Lutheran—Historic Trinity Lutheran Church was founded in 1850 as the first Missouri Synod Lutheran Church in Detroit. The finest in liturgical art can be found in Historic Trinity's stone, glass, wood, tile and brass. Its style is 16th century Pier and Clerestory Gothic, similar to that seen only in the great cathedrals of Europe.

Fort Street Presbyterian—When first constructed, Fort Street Presbyterian Church sat in the middle of a wealthy neighborhood where many leaders of industry lived. These leaders envisioned a Protestant church with a congregation that looked a lot like them. By the 1890s, however, the demographics of the neighborhood had changed, and the community around the church became far more mixed.

Ste. Anne de Detroit—In 1701, twenty-five canoes glided to a stop at the foot of a high bluff which ran along a narrow part of the Detroit River near where Hart Plaza is today. French explorer Cadillac and his party began construction including a chapel that was dedicated to Ste. Anne. The parish has gone through many changes in its 300-plus years of history but the basilica stands and is used for worship daily.
